Membership Application

The Black Family Stem Cell Institute (BFSCI) is initiating a re-evaluation of its membership and solicits applications for membership from Mount Sinai faculty, including existing members who wish to participate in future BFSCI activities.

Eligibility: The BFSCI consists of faculty members who are using stem cells to address both basic and applied research questions related to biology and medicine. Membership is open to full-time faculty in both clinical and basic research departments at Mount Sinai who are committed to stem cell-related research as evidenced by publications, current research and/or funding for ongoing studies. Studies of stem or progenitor cells that play a role in embryonic or adult lineage decisions or early development in vertebrate and invertebrate systems are appropriate for consideration. An important goal of the Institute will be to create a stimulating intellectual environment for the exchange of ideas and the establishment of new collaborations among its members. It will also serve as a forum within the Mount Sinai community for publicizing its research programs. Members are expected to contribute actively to the various activities of the Institute, including development of new courses and teaching, recruitment of new faculty, and organization of and participation in seminars, meetings, and a Stem Cell Biology journal club.

Deadline: December 1, 2006.

Application process: Face page (see below), current NIH format biosketch, description of research program as it applies to the goals of the BFSCI, and summary of relevant teaching. *Applications will be reviewed by the Executive Committee of the BFSCI on a semi-annual basis.*
